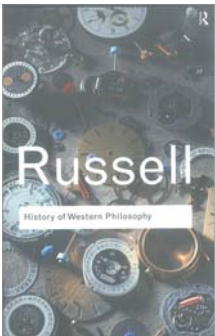

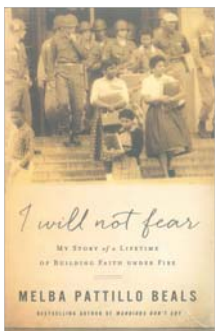


### ***History of Western Philosophy***

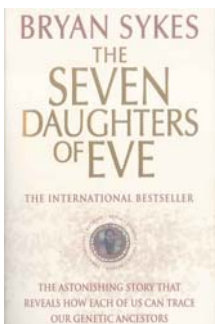


### ***I Will Not Fear : My Story of a Lifetime of Building Faith Under Fire***

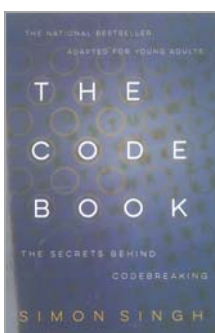


### ***The Seven Daughters of Eve***

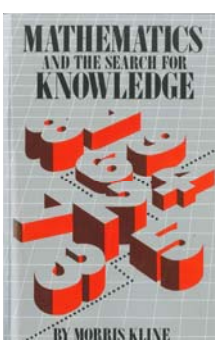


### ***The Code Book : the Secrets Behind Codebreaking***
