



Wendy Mass is the New York Times bestselling author of fourteen novels for young people (which have been translated into fourteen languages and nominated for sixty-eight state book awards), including *A Mango-Shaped Space* (which was awarded the Schneider Family Book Award by the American Library Association), the *Twice Upon a Time fairy-tales* series, *11 Birthdays*, and *13 Gifts* ("About Me").

In an interview Wendy Mass said that she became interested in writing when she wrote her first short story in 5th grade. She co-wrote it with her two sisters and it was about their cat that turned into a goat and broke into the neighbor's house. By the time she was in high school, she knew that she wanted to be an author. She spent most of college writing short stories, and when she graduated she got a job in publishing (The Just).

She was named the New Jersey Association of School Librarian's 2018 Author of the Year. Her hobbies include geocaching, virtual reality, and magic tricks. She lives with her family in northwest New Jersey ("About Me").

begin to happen as the day of their birthday begins to repeat itself over and over again.




13 Gifts
