



Carl Hiaasen born on March 12, 1953 is an American journalist and bestselling novelist. Born and raised in Plantation, Florida (near Fort Lauderdale), Carl was the first of four children and the son of a lawyer ("Carl Hiaasen (1953 –)"). Carl Hiaasen has been writing about Florida since his father gave him a typewriter at age 6 ("Carl Hiaasen").

He has a degree in journalism from the University of Florida. He became an investigative journalist, concentrating on construction and property

development - exposing schemes to destroy, for profit's sake, Florida's natural beauty. Eventually, in the 1980s, he embarked on a career as a novelist ("Carl Hiaasen (1953 –)").

He writes books for adults and young readers. His books are filled with humor and have a variety of interesting, unusual characters. Many of his stories are about environmental protection in Florida. Hiaasen's first novel for young readers, *Hoot*, was the recipient of numerous awards, including a prestigious Newbery Honor, and was made into a film. His other books for young readers include *Flush*, *Skink* and *Squirm* ("Carl Hiaasen").


